



ASCOT VALE PRIMARY SCHOOL CHILD SAFE STANDARD 6- STRATEGIES TO IDENTIFY AND REDUCE OR REMOVE RISKS OF CHILD ABUSE

Developed July-November 2016.

Passed by School Council 19th December 2016

INTENT OF CHILD SAFE STANDARD 6

Ascot Vale Primary School's School Council must develop, implement, monitor and evaluate risk management strategies to ensure child safety in the organisation's environments.

RISK ASSESSMENT - IMPLEMENTATION

Ascot Vale Primary School will adopt the following Processes for identifying and reducing or removing risks of child abuse;

1. Identify the school's child safety risks across the range of school environments using the DET risk assessment template (see link below) as well as a similar methodology in for all school excursion, camps and activity planning
 - (i) Risk assessment should include but not be limited to: Swimming, Incursions, Excursions, Camps, Tour guides, Use of buses to transport, extra-curricular activities (eg fete, concerts, movie nights), Classroom visitors, Times outside supervision times of 8.45-3.45pm on school days, external toilets, Athletics or sporting events on or offsite, students staying in during breaks, POD & clean up duty, Contractors onsite, Parents & Grandparents, students with a disability,
2. Identify any existing risk mitigation measures or internal controls.
3. Assess and rate the school's child safety risks given the existing controls in place, taking into account the likelihood of risk, and the likely consequence of the risk.
4. If the risk rating is more than the 'acceptable level', identify further risk management strategies through additional controls or other prevention, detection or mitigation strategies and then re-assess the risk.

The risk management process will be documented, recorded and reviewed periodically. Effective risk management strategies are dynamic and change over time as new risks arise and others may no longer be relevant. Effective risk management strategies need to be transparent, well understood and diverse, to take account of the increased level of risk associated with the specific nature of some activities and the vulnerability of particular groups.
